Note: 1696750 Turbo Kit or 1696672 Bagging Boot, Blade and Baffle Kit will be needed for the 48" Fabricated Deck on a Regent™.

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General Information

Operator Safety

Safety Alert Symbol and Signal Words

The safety alert symbol is used to identify safety information about hazards that can result in personal injury. A signal word (DANGER, WARNING, or CAUTION) is used with the alert symbol to indicate the likelihood and potential severity of injury. In addition, a hazard symbol may be used to represent the type of hazard.

DANGER indicates a hazard which, if not avoided, will result in death or serious injury.

WARNING indicates a hazard which, if not avoided, could result in death or serious injury.

CAUTION indicates a hazard which, if not avoided, could result in minor or moderate injury.

NOTICE indicates an action that could result in damage to the product.

A DANGER

- DO NOT operate the unit without either the entire grass catcher or the deflector in place.
- Turn off the PTO to disengage the blades when not mowing.
- DO NOT mow in reverse unless absolutely necessary. Always look down and behind before and while traveling in reverse.

▲ DANGER

Amputation or Laceration Hazard

- If the mower stalls or the collection system plugs, disengage the electric clutch (PTO), stop the engine and remove the key. Set the parking brake. Wait for moving parts to stop. Remove the foreign object or clear the chute with a piece of wood before restarting the engine. Never place hands into the blower housing to clear a jammed object.
- Disengage the electric clutch (PTO). Shut off the engine, remove the key, and wait for all moving parts to stop before attaching, adjusting, or disconnecting any part of the collection system.
- DO NOT make adjustments or repairs while the engine is running or blades are moving.
- DO NOT not place hands or feet near rotating parts.



Thrown Objects Hazard

Do not open the cover while the blades are turning.

- Check the collection system to make sure it is bolted tightly to the unit.
- Collector bags are subject to deterioration and wear during normal use. Inspect the bag periodically for tears, holes, or weak spots and replace with a new bag that meets manufacturer's durability standards.

Marning W

Loss of Control, Roll-over and Tipping Hazard

- Use a reduced speed on uneven ground and when turning corners.
- Reduce loads on hillsides. It is recommended that the collection system be kept only half full when mowing any slope. Start mowing on slopes when the collection system is empty.
- Mow up and down the face of slopes; never across the face of any slope.
- Never operate on slopes greater than 17.6% (10°).
- Select a slow ground speed before driving onto a slope. Avoid using brakes to control speed.
- Use caution when changing directions and DO NOT start or stop the tractor while on a slope.

Safety Decals

Before operating the grass catcher, read and understand the installed safety decals. The decals are provided to help you avoid personal injury or damage to the product.



Assembly



MARNING

Disengage the electric clutch (PTO). Shut off the engine, remove the key, and wait for all moving parts to stop before attaching, adjusting, or disconnecting any part of the collection system.

Install the Upright Support Assembly

- 1. Install the speed nuts (A, Figure 1) into the square holes (a) of the rear frame support. The threaded side of speed nut is installed on the inside of the frame support.
- 2. Install the shoulder bolts (B) into the speed nuts.



3. Put the upright support assembly (C, Figure 2) onto the shoulder bolts.



Install the Baffles

For 46" Mower Decks

- 1. Put the deflector (a, Figure 3) in the vertical position.
- 2. Put the baffle (**D**) into the discharge opening. Attach the left side of the baffle with a carriage bolt (E), spacer (F) and a whiz lock nut (G).



3. Attach the right side of the baffle with a carriage bolt (H, Figure 4) and a whiz lock nut (G). Make sure the blade does not come in contact with the baffle.



For 52" Mower Decks

- 1. Put the deflector (a, Figure 5) in the vertical position.
- 2. Put the baffle (I) into the discharge opening. Attach the left side of the baffle with a carriage bolt (E), spacer (J) and a whiz lock nut (G).



3. Attach the left side of the baffle with a carriage bolt (**H**, Figure 6) and a whiz lock nut (**G**). Make sure the blade does not come in contact with the baffle.



Install the Cover Support and Cover Assembly

1. Attach the cross support (**K**, Figure 7) onto the hitch assembly (**a**) with the carriage bolts (**L**) and the whiz lock nuts (**M**).



2. Put the corner brackets (**a**, Figure 8) on the cover assembly (**N**, Figure 8) onto the pivot hinges (**b**). Install the hinge pins (**O**) and hair pins (**P**).



Install the Boot Mounting Hardware

Note: It is not necessary to install the hardware onto the 48" mower deck.

46" and 52" Mower Decks

1. On the left side of the discharge opening, insert the carriage bolt (**Q**, Figure 9) through inside of the mower deck and secure with conical nut (**R**).



Frame Hung Mowers

- 1. Remove and discard the existing hardware from outside of the right wheel bracket.
- 2. On the inside of the deck, insert the carriage bolt (**S**, Figure 10). Attach the spacer (**T**), washer (**U**) and the flange locknut (**V**).



Free Floating Mowers

On the inside of the deck, install carriage bolt (S, Figure 11). Attach the washer (U), spacer (T), washer (W) and the flange locknut (V).



Install the Bagging Boot

For 46" and 52" Mower Decks

1. Make sure the latch hardware on the bagging boot (**X**, Figure 12) is in the correct hole for the deck sizes. If necessary, change location of the latch hardware.



- 2. Attach the left side of bagging boot onto the carriage bolt assembly (a, Figure 13) installed on the deck.
- 3. Slide the top of the bagging boot below the deflector mounting bracket (**b**).
- Slide the tab (c) of the bagging boot into the mower deck.



Frame Hung Mowers

1. Rotate the latch (**a**, Figure 14) into the space between the spacer and the washer hardware (**b**).



2. Secure the hook (**c**, Figure 15) of the mounting strap onto the gage wheel bracket (**d**).



Free Floating Mowers

1. Rotate the latch (**a** Figure 16) into the space between the spacer and the washer hardware (**b**).



2. Secure the hook (**g**, Figure 17) of the mounting strap onto the roller bar support bracket (**h**).



Assemble the Upper and Middle Tube For 46" and 52" Mower Decks

- Slide the middle tube (Y, Figure 18) into the upper tube (Z).
- 2. Align the holes for the deck sizes and install the screw (AA) into the upper tube and middle tube.



3. Slide the ridge (a) on the upper tube into the cutout (b) in the cover assembly (N).



4. Slide the middle tube (**Y**, Figure 19) over the bagging boot (**X**). Attach the strap (**c**) over the pin (**d**).



Install the Collector Bags

- 1. Put the cover in the vertical position.
- Attach the collector bags (AB, Figure 21) to the tabs (a) on the cross support.
- 3. Close the cover.



Operation



WARNING

Disengage the electric clutch (PTO). Shut off the engine, remove the key, and wait for all moving parts to stop before attaching, adjusting, or disconnecting any part of the collection system.

ALWAYS shut off the tractor, disengage the PTO, and allow all moving parts to stop BEFORE disconnecting or clearing the tube, or emptying the grass bags.

Before Operation

Remove all sticks, stones, or other debris, which can get caught or thrown by the mower blades.

For best results, mow when the grass is dry. Wet grass can clump and block the mower and grass collector.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN MOWING, make sure the bottom of the mower and the bottom of the catcher cover are clear of grass and debris.

For satisfactory grass collection, air circulation from the mower deck, through the chute, and into the grass catcher is very important.

Make sure there are tight connections between the mower deck, turbo housing, tubes, and grass catcher cover.

Mowing with the Grass Collector

Always operate the riding mower with the throttle at full speed.

If grass is long, slow the ground speed and cut half the width of the mower to prevent blockage. Another method is to cut once with the deck in a high setting and then cut again with the deck in a low setting.

Do not open the cover with the mower engaged.

If a large amount of cut grass ejects from the bottom of the deck, the tube may be blocked or the bags may be full. Stop the rider, disengage the PTO, stop the engine and then empty the collector or remove the blockage from the tube.

Recommended Accessories

Use front counterweights if operating on slopes when a rear attachment is installed. Two rear wheel weights can also be added. Never operate on slopes greater than 17.6% (10°).

WARNING

When operating without the collector, the mower deflector MUST be installed in the down position and retained with the spring latch.

Remove the Collector

For 46", 52" and 48" Fabricated Decks

- 1. Lift up the cover assembly and remove and empty bags.
- 2. Unhook the strap from the pin. Remove the middle tube and upper tube from the bagging boot and the cover.
- 3. Remove the boot and lift off the collector from the upright support.

The removal of the baffles is not required of the 46" and 52" mowers.

Storage

Clean the grass collector with a mild detergent. Remove debris from the screen on the bottom of the lid.

If paint is scratched on metal parts, paint the parts again, or apply a thin layer of oil to prevent corrosion.

Keep in a dry area. Dry fully before long term of storage. Always store away from moisture.
